



# Everlywell at home test kit from Northeast Tri County Health District

*Testing through Northeast Tri County Health District (NETCHD) should be supplemental to local testing efforts by partnering agencies. Not replacing.*

## To obtain an Everlywell at home test kit from NETCHD:

- You must be 16 years of age or older.
- Unable to locate testing through a local medical facility or provider.
- Presenting symptoms common to COVID-19.
- Have an active email account. One account per test.
- Agree to isolate until results are received and complete isolation requirements if test is positive.

Due to limited supply available, you may be directed to area clinics where testing is available.

- Test kits available are limited to one test per person.
- Test kits will NOT be provided for travel or required testing for employer.



## How to request an Everlywell at home test kit from NETCHD:

**\*DO NOT enter the building for testing or to obtain a test kit.\***

To arrange a time to pick up a test kit call NETCHD at (509) 684-2262.

- **Step 1: Contact your healthcare provider or local medical facilities for available testing.**
  - If testing cannot be obtained through provider or other local medical facilities, contact Northeast Tri County Health District (NETCHD).
  - NETCHD staff may ask what providers or facilities were contacted prior to providing a test kit.
  
- **Step 2: Call NETCHD at (509) 684-2262 to arrange a time to pick up a test kit.**
  - Scheduled pick up for test kits will be mornings from 8am – 9am. Must call ahead.
  - Staff will bring test kit to your car. DO NOT enter the building.



## 3 Key Steps to Take While Waiting for your COVID-19 Test Results

### 1. Stay home and monitor your health

- a. DO NOT go into public places, schools, or other people's home.
- b. DO NOT have guest at your home.
- c. Stay away from others in the home if possible.
- d. Let your employer know you are awaiting COVID-19 test results and cannot come to work or school.

### 2. Think about people you have recently been around.

- a. If diagnosed with COVID-19, anyone who was near you 48 hours prior to start of symptoms for a total of 15 minutes within a 24-hour period will be considered a close contact.

### 3. Answer the phone call from Northeast Tri County Health District or Department of Health.

- a. Discussions are confidential.
- b. Your information will not be shared without your permission.

### If you test positive:

- Isolate for 10 full days from when symptoms first started and if you have/had a fever it should be gone for at least 24hours before ending isolation.
- If Asymptomatic isolate for 10 full days from date of test.
- Close contacts and household members will need to quarantine for 14 days from last exposure to you. (for more information go to: [COVID-19: When to Quarantine | CDC](#) )
